AMBULANCE BUSINESS

Tammy Barton, Ambulance Director, informed the Commission that the runs have increased this year by 100, she is requesting an additional 20 hours to enter information into the state system. After discussion, Commissioner Tebbs made a <u>MOTION</u> to approve the additional 20 hours. Seconded by Commissioner LeFevre. Motion carried. Voting unanimous.

PUBLIC WORKS BUSINESS

Brian Bremner, County Engineer, gave the Commission an update on the revision of the Resource Management Plan.

Commissioner Tebbs made a <u>MOTION</u> to go to Public Hearing to discuss Snowplowing in the Mammoth Creek Area. Seconded by Commissioner LeFevre. Motion carried. Voing unanimous.

Public Comments:

Larry Hughes, President, Mammoth Creek Homeowners Association, stated that the majority of the homeowners are opposed to snowplowing. He is requesting that no encroachment permits be issued in Upper Mammoth Creek.

Mike Rose stated that he disagrees with the statement that the majority of property owners are opposed to snowplowing. He is concerned about emergency services being able to access his property.

Sharon Reynolds, Yellow Pines Subdivision, stated that they oppose plowing because of concerns regarding vandalism.

Landon Davidson, representing Thomas and Catherine Christensen, mailed out a survey to other property owners. He provided the results of the survey to the Commission. The Christensen's support year-round access to the properties.

Bill Cartright stated that he opposes plowing.

Paul Thompson, Aspen Highlands Subdivision, stated that some property owners are plowing their own access or hire a contractor to plow as allowed in the current agreement with the Homeowners Association. The plowing agreement has been in effect for several years and has been effective. He supports the current agreement.

Bob Tullman, Aspen Highlands, is a year-round resident, plows his own roads and has health problems. He supports plowing.

Trevor Perret, stated that a comprehensive plan needs to be developed for plowing and then a vote can be taken.

Virginia Valcourt, Tommy Creek, stated that she supports year round access to her property and the roads being cleared.

James Mosier stated that he has a snowblower and would be willing to contract to provide the services.

Commissioner Tebbs made a <u>MOTION</u> to return to General Session. Seconded by Commissioner LeFevre. Motion carried. Voting unanimous.

Mammoth Creek Snowplowing: The Commission will take the comments under advisement.

TRAVEL COUNCIL BUSINESS

Falyn Owens, Director, led a discussion regarding the Highway 12 budget. The Commission will meet with John Holland, Highway 12 Coordinator before the budget is finalized.

FLSA CHANGES

On December 1, 2016 the wage requirements will be increased for exempt employees. There are two county employees that are classified as exempt employees whose wage will not meet the qualifications. After discussion, Commissioner Tebbs made a <u>MOTION</u> to approve the salary increases effective December 1, 2016, approximately \$7,000.00 total. Seconded by Commissioner LeFevre. Motion carried. Voting unanimous.

UTAH'S PATCHWORK PARKWAY

Nancy Dalton and Dutch Deutschlander gave the Commission the annual report for Utah's Patchwork Parkway Scenic Byway 143. The funding request for 2017 is \$5,000.00 and will be included in the Travel Council Budget.
